2018 General Assembly to Convene in St. Louis

The 223nd General Assembly (2018) of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) meets June 16–23 in St. Louis, Missouri.

The GA is the national gathering of our denomination and is made up of delegations of teaching elders and ruling elders in equal numbers from each Presbytery in the country. The delegates will decide upon the important issues facing the denomination, first in committee deliberations and then in plenary sessions. The decisions they will make will address Presbyterian theology, worship, mission work, financial concerns, and more. In addition to the formal business of the denomination, GA provides an opportunity for the many and various Presbyterian organizations to meet and promote their ministries.

The first action of the GA will be the election of the moderator, who will not only chair the GA, but will also serve as our denomination's ambassador for the next two years. This year, three sets of candidates are up for consideration for this post: Ruling Elder Chantal Atnip of the Presbytery of Carlisle (New Jersey) with Rev. Ken Hockenberry (Presbytery of Chicago) as her vice-moderator; Rev. Eliana Maxim (Presbytery of Seattle) and Rev. Bertram Johnson (Presbytery of New York City) running as co-moderators; and Ruling Elder Vilmarie Cintron-Olivieri (Presbytery of Tropical Florida) and Rev. Cindy Kohlmann (Presbytery of Boston) also running as co-moderators.


Summer Activities & Fellowship Fun!

Pastor's Page



Dear Friends:

Every spring, First Presbyterian Church elects officers to be our servant leaders. This past April, we elected Lane Hough, Diana Westfall, and Kim Wise as new ruling elders and Penny Epley, Marcy Eves, Deb Gamble, and Carol O'Kane as our new deacons. They will be installed in worship on June 3. I ask that you surround them with your prayers as they begin their

ministry on behalf of this congregation. As these leaders begin their terms of service, so ends the terms of three Elders and four Deacons. I would like to thank these retiring officers for their gifts of time and talent to this church.

Bev Etling: Bev completes six years on Session where she served as chair of the Membership and Evangelism Committee. During her tenure, this committee merged with the Events Committee, forming the Membership, Evangelism and Events Committee (M.E.E.). This committee sponsored a host of special events and welcomed dozens of new members to our fellowship. Bev also led the Nominating Committee for a couple of years.

Kelley Flynn: Kelley has served three years on Session as the Elder for Christian Education. She was instrumental in leading us through the transition in CE Directors and for maintaining the high quality of programs during this transition and during the building project.

Gary Hinzman: Gary spent six years on the Session, directing the Outreach Committee. He was an avid spokesman for our special offerings and for the mission projects of the church, including the youth mission trips. Gary also served for four years as the head of the Personnel Committee, during which time he helped us find a new CE director.
