Following lunch, about 12:45 pm, a presentation by Bev Etling will highlight how American patriotism began and has changed over the years since the founding of our country. Update on the 29 West Property

Since last spring, the Session has been looking into what we can do with the 29 West Property, also known as the Annex and as the Hannah Mayne House. (It's the blue building to the east of the church.) After considering several options, the Session narrowed them down to two choices: selling the property or keeping the property and demolishing the building eventually. Elder Jim Hines has taken the lead in helping us reach a decision, but since he has been on vacation for the last several weeks, no decisions have been made.

While the Session was considering this issue, a business expressed an interest in buying the property. In preparation for a formal offer, the Session commissioned an appraisal of the property. The appraiser set the value between \$270,000 and \$305,000, based on comparable sales and an analysis of the property. In late September, the same business made an offer to purchase the property—the building, the garage, and the land including the parking lot--for \$150, 000. The Session determined that this offer was too low, and the purchase request was rejected. The business has not made another offer and, as far as the Session knows, is not planning to make one.

The Session will continue its process of discernment and will keep the congregation informed and involved in the process.

The Presbytery of the Scioto Valley Older Adult Ministry Network sponsored a regional conference on older adults at Worthington Presbyterian Church on October 12. About one hundred adults from across the country, including the Rev. Kristin Schutte, Janet Withers, and

Bill Hitt from Westerville First Presbyterian, participated. The theme of the conference was "The Best of Times: God's Call in the Third Thirty of Life." The keynote address was delivered by the Rev. Ray Jones, who spoke of the importance of older adults in shaping the life of the church.

Twelve breakout workshops dealing with opportunities and problems faced by those over the age of 60 were offered. The Rev. Rob Coberly led a workshop focused on communication with persons with Alzheimer's disease. A session on Livable Communities was led by the director of



Age Friendly Columbus, Katie White. That organization, funded by an AARP grant, is conducting a 5-year project that addresses issues such as volunteerism, transportation, social events, park placement, and others. A session that focused on social justice discussed the tensions that sometimes arise as clergy address the spiritual foundations of activity in the public arena. All in all, the conference was a day well spent!

Pastor's Page

Dear Friends:

Back in 2008, the building at 29 West College Avenue went up for sale. For most of us at First Presbyterian, this was a concern because the good doctor who owned the property had allowed us to park in his lot on weekends and in the evenings. We all wondered nervously about who might buy the property and would they allow us to have the same sort of arrangement.

At least most of us thought that way. One member of our church saw the situation in a different light. This member saw the property as an opportunity to expand the ministry of the church through the extra space provided by the extra land we now owned. This visionary member saw that if we ever wanted to enlarge our church building, we would need more land than we currently had. The building was a nice bonus, but the land was essential in this person's mind. This person saw an opportunity for the church and had the means to allow the church to take advantage of the opportunity. Thanks to this generous gift, the church purchased the property. The generosity did not stop there as this person also gave money that served as the seed money to build the new addition which we are now enjoying.

Now that we have finished our building expansion we now need to decide on what to do with the 29 West property. As with all significant decisions, this one requires all of us to engage in the process of discernment—discernment as to what God would have us do. Discernment is difficult work for a congregation for there are many views and many possibilities that need to get evaluated and this takes time and effort. Yet in the end, it is the only way for a church to move forward.

I recently found a prayer by the famous Christian author, William Barclay, and I think it speaks to our situation. I invite all of us to pray this prayer in the coming weeks and months so that we may have God's guidance and blessing for our decision.

O God, you know that soon we must make a decision which is going to affect our whole church. Help us to choose rightly; and to <u>choose</u> the right way. Grant us your guidance, and with it grant us the humble obedience to accept it. Help us not necessarily to choose what we want to do, but what you want us to do. Grant that we may not be swayed solely by fear or by hope of gain; by the desire for an easy path or by a longing for prestige. Help us today in humble obedience to say to you, "Lord, what will you have us to do?" and then await your guidance, and accept your leading. Hear this prayer of ours and send an answer so clear that we cannot mistake it. This we ask for your love's sake! Amen.
