Reaching out to Refugees Next Meeting: Sunday, March 1, 11:30 am, Fellowship Hall

Our church is one big step closer to helping a refugee family settle in the Columbus area! On February 25, eighteen of us attended the Community Refugee and Immigration Services (CRIS) training at the CRIS offices. Now we have a more detailed idea of what to expect and can get ready to welcome a refugee family. The meeting on March 1 will allow us to identify



the resources we have and those we need to contact or obtain. Any financial support necessary for this outreach will come from the church's Mission Fund.

Right now, we don't know where the family will be coming from or how many adults and children it includes. (It might be just one person.) When we are as ready as we can be, we will inform CRIS. Then we'll wait for a time, ranging from a week to months, to be assigned a family. Next, we will quickly work with CRIS to find an appropriate place, probably an apartment, for this family to live. CRIS, of course, has many contacts to help with this. We will also help furnish this apartment, as needed. CRIS and the Furniture Bank will help with this, too.

Here are some other ways we will support this family:

- **Airport Arrival:** We will be at the airport to greet and welcome the family members as they arrive. The assigned CRIS caseworker will be there, too.
- **Welcome Meal:** We will provide a culturally appropriate hot meal immediately upon the family's arrival at their new home.
- Welcome Kit: Our church's first task is to gather the many items for this kit, such as plates and silverware, a vacuum, and toothbrushes. We'll talk about that on March 1.
- **Rental Assistance:** We are asked to provide a deposit and the first month's rent, which we will take from our Mission Fund.

Our main goal will be to form a relationship with this family. We will serve as guides, advocates, and friends. Although CRIS will support the family for 90 days as it resettles, our church's commitment is for six months and can continue beyond that time.

If you would like to be involved in this project, please come to the March 1 meeting. Your help will be much appreciated! Or you can ask Linda Barr, Bill McCormick, or Mary Bricker for more information. We'll share the news about our assigned family as soon as we get it!

2020 Per Capita

A Presbyterian Community Fund

Per capita is a set amount of money per member that each congregation pays to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). It is like a Presbyterian community fund--part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Sharing our financial resources with one another is one of the ways that we demonstrate God's love and trust and connection. Sharing enables us to reach beyond what we can see. This year, our church will pay \$37.75 per member (*per capita*).

The Session encourages each of us, if we are able, to contribute the *per capita* amount for our own membership. Doing so allows the Session to use more of our financial resources for mission, programs, and operating expenses. To contribute the \$37.75 *per capita* amount for your membership, just write 'per capita' on your check.

Welcome!

We now have a special way of welcoming first-time visitors to our worship service. Welcoming scrolls, which include a copy of the *Advocate* and other information, are located at the College Avenue entrance and in the Gathering Place near the sign-up book. If you are aware of a first-time visitor, please get a scroll and present it to them. This kind gesture will be warmly received.

Update on 29 West College Property (February 2020)

First Presbyterian Church and the City of Westerville have agreed upon terms for the construction of a new parking lot on the site of the 29 West College property. The written agreement between FPC and the City was approved by Session at its meeting on February 10 and was presented to the congregation at our Annual Meeting on February 23.

What's next:

- Once approved by the congregation, the agreement will then need to be approved by the Presbytery of Scioto Valley. This will occur at the Commission for Presbytery Operations meeting on March 9.
- Once approved by FPC and the Presbytery, the agreement will then go before Westerville City Council for its approval.

In the meantime:

- The Uptown Review Board needs to approve the demolition of the house. This may be a challenge since its role (goal) is the protection of historic structures within the Uptown District, and it has identified 29 West College as a "significant structure" within Uptown.
- The parking lot plan must also be approved by the Westerville Planning Commission, but we don't anticipate this approval to be nearly as challenging as the approval from the Uptown Review Board.

Our estimated timing (to the best of our collective knowledge):

- Uptown Review in March 2020
- Planning Commission also in March 2020
- City Council approval in March or April 2020
- Demolition (tentatively) in LATE SPRING or EARLY SUMMER
- Parking lot construction in MID-to-LATE SUMMER 2020

As a side note, we are having the legal agreement (lease agreement) with the City reviewed by Attorney Bill Patterson (son-in-law of Bernie and John Simpkins).

Pastor's Page

"For in the gospel, the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, 'The one who is righteous will live by faith.'" – Romans 1:17

With the beginning of March, we also come to the beginning of Lent, one of the most significant seasons in the life of the church. Lent traditionally has been a time for spiritual formation and renewal—a time to rededicate ourselves to the practice of our faith. Among the practices that we are called to do is the regular reading of scripture. How else are we to know the teachings of Jesus, the stories of the saints and the basics of our faith if we don't go to the source—our Bible? And yet, many of us are lax in our reading of scripture—not because we don't want to or we don't have the time, but because we are intimidated by the task. The Bible is a big book, and it is full of all sorts of things, many of which are hard to understand. Many have opened the Bible to begin reading it, only to put it down again after struggling through an odd chapter.

However, given that Lent is a time of refocusing our spiritual devotions, I am going to encourage each of you to read part of the Bible for Lent. And I want to start you out with the best part first—the Gospels. The four Gospels tell the story of Jesus in four different ways, and yet they all point to the same conclusion—that this Jesus was the Christ, the Son of God, who was sent to be our salvation. The Gospels form the basis of our faith, and as such, they are the best place to start when reading the Bible.

To help us get into the Gospels, I will focus my preaching on each of the Gospels during the weeks of Lent. I will also add the Book of Acts to the list, because Acts is a continuation of the Gospel of Luke, a sequel, if you will. I will give you an introduction to each of the books and give you some hints on how to read them to get the most from them. My hope is that you will read one or more of these books during Lent...and after Lent you will read the rest of them.
